On May 5, 2014 my Province of Immaculate Conception joined with St Anthony of Padua Province to form the new Province of Our Lady of the Angels. The territory of this new province



includes the East Coast of the United States, Ontario Canada and Costa Rica, as well as friars living and serving in several other countries.

The friars look at this new beginning as an opportunity to reenergize our Franciscan spirit and more effectively serve parishes and other ministries across this vast region. Our feast day is August 2nd, the feast of our Lady of the Angels also known as the feast of St Mary of the Angels.

As you may know the little church of Our Lady of the Angels, the "Little Portion" (aka Portiuncula) was very important in the life of St. Francis. As his early biographer, Thomas of Celano stated. "This place the holy man loved more than other places in the world; for here he began humbly, here he progressed virtuously, here he ended happily"

St. Francis by St. Bonaventure.)

"The Portiuncula was an old church dedicated to the Virgin Mother of God which was abandoned . Francis had great devotion to the Queen of the world and

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sincerely hope to be able to keep up my visitations and to share in your fraternal gatherings. I hope you will find me approachable and willing to be of service in whatever way I can. I will do my best to keep you informed of what is happening in the Region.

I have the good fortune of living in "farm country." It never ceases to amaze me how diligent the farmers are with their land. From the moment the snows melt, they are out in the fields tilling, fertilizing, digging irrigation trenches and always repairing broken fences and fallen limbs. Then the planting begins and the seeds are spread throughout the acreage. The Lord provides the right amount of sunshine and rain to ensure a hearty harvest. When I drive by, I can almost see the corn grow! There are fields of yellow canola, soy beans, corn and of course hay for their livestock. Not a square inch of land is wasted. He then plants the seeds in our hearts that God hopes will one day grow into wonderful plants of His love. 

when he saw that the church was deserted, he began to live there constantly in order to repair it. He heard that the Angels often visited it, so that it was called Saint Mary of the Angels, and he decided to stay there permanently out of reverence for the angels and love for the Mother of Christ.

He loved this spot more than any other in the world. It was here he began his religious life in a very small way; it is here he came to a happy end. When he was dying, he commended this spot above all others to the friars, because it was most dear to the Blessed Virgin. He often said to the friars, 'See to it my sons, that you never abandon this place. If you are thrown out of one door, go back through another, for this is truly a holy place, and the dwelling place of Christ and His Virgin Mother'.

As he was living there by the church of Our Lady, Francis prayed to her who had conceived the Word, full of grace and truth, begging her insistently and with tears to become his advocate. Then he was granted the true spirit of the Gospel by the intercession of the Mother of mercy and he brought it to fruition.

He embraced the Mother of Our Lord Jesus with indescribable love because, as he said, it was she who made the Lord of majesty our brother, and through her we found mercy. After Christ, he put all his trust in her and took her as his patroness for himself and his friars."

I ask you to please pray to our Lady of the Angels for the friars of my new province and for all the secular Franciscans.

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF ST. LOUIS

Let us use this Jubilee Year to go deeper into how our baptism is connected to our profession to the Secular Franciscan Order.

Louis was born on April 25, 1214 and was baptized on the same day. Louis was not born a saint ...he was a person like us... he struggled all his life against his flaws. With the help of God's grace, he controlled and overcome himself in various circumstances until his death. In his heart he nourished the desire to be conformed to the Gospel. He lived his entire life being aware of his dignity as child of God called to holiness; which gave him a contagious holiness expressed in his life and his teachings.

We commemorate the eight-hundredth anniversary of birth of St. Louis of France: the co-patron of the OFS. We want to learn from him how to develop the grace of our baptism in our lives, and reach its fullness, which is perfection of charity.

A baptism to live Baptism cannot be just an event that occurred in our past. It has to irrigate our whole life, enlighten our choices, and guide our sacrifices. The reality of our baptism must be embodied in the reality of our life. (Rule 6, GG.CC. 14,3a; GG.CC. 17-27)

Saint Louis accomplished that. His baptism

with repercussions: he tried
to live as a
Christian, to
seek justice as
a Christian, to
assume his
duty as a king
and as a
Christian. He



did all this in his time, and according to the culture of his time, even faced with opposition. Following his example, today we are to be faithful to our baptism, to live as Christians, to think as Christians, to act as Christians in our time and in our culture, even when our surroundings present opposition.

Everyone can become saint! St. Louis' entire life contributed to making him a "saint."

Holiness is the condition of a life lived with Christ, who is "the Way, the Truth and the Life." (Jn 14,6) In this Jubilee Year, we want to renew the promises of our Baptism and of our profession in the OFS, thus moving forward on the path of sanctity, along with our brothers and sisters.



FROM THE TREASURER

Saint John XXIII – the Pope of Peace and...a member of Secular Franciscan Order

Recently the Church gave us two more Saints to intercede for us in Heaven. One of the - my bellowed countryman, Saint Pope John Paul II, is already much loved and known to us all, so today I bring to you our Franciscan Brother - Saint John XXIII, who by the way was elected Pope on my 5th birthday.

John XXIII – Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was born on 25 of November, 1881 in Sotto Il Monte in the province of Bergamo. He was the fourth in a family of 14. When he was twelve, he entered the Lower Seminary in Bergamo. Here he began the practice of writing spiritual notes, which he continued in one form or another until his death, and which have been gathered together in the Journal a Soul. Here he also began the deeply cherished practice of regular spiritual direction. During his seminary times he was admitted to the Secular Franciscan Order. Many years later, He said during his Lateran Speech

"Dear Brethren, please allow me to address with special affection all those present here who belong to the "peaceful army" of the Franciscan Third Order. I am Joseph, your brother. I am speaking to you with tenderness. I was just a 14 years young adolescent when on March 1, in 1896 I was enlisted as Franciscan by Canon Luigi Isacchi, our spiritual father, the director of our seminary in Bergamo. I praise the Lord for this grace."

On another occasion, Saint Pope John the XXIII wrote to his relative, Enrico Marchesi, "Befriend the Bothers Minor. They have the spirit of Saint Francis, who is pure love, humility, meekness, simplicity, and peace."

Earlier, as cardinal, in his letter to all Franciscans he said "I love Saint Francis and his sons. From childhood I am a Franciscan Tertiary since I was fourteen (....) I entered my priesthood as diocesan priest, but St. Francis was my closest of all saints, along with the company of other saints who were his friends (....) May the love of Christ and the love of Saint Francis burn in your hearts. Oh, what a sweetness, what a joy".


John XXIII was declared Blessed by Pope John Paul II on September 3, 2000 in Saint Peter's Square, during the celebration of the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000.

Following his beatification, his body was moved on June 3, 2001 from its original place to the altar of Saint Jerome where it could be seen by the faithful. He was canonized on April 27, 2014. John XXIII today is affectionately known as the "Good Pope" and in Italian, "il Papa buono".

His feast day is not celebrated on the date of his death as is usual, but it is on October 11, the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council.

During my 2011 pilgrimage to Rome we were privileged to have the Holy Mass celebrated at this very altar where the "Good Pope" is laid to rest.

I am writing to you from the Valley of the Angels Orphanage in Guatemala. I have been blessed to be able to bring youth to this very blessed space for a second time: to say that it feels like home is an understatement. It is a blessing to see our Canadian



youth bond with their Guatemala brothers and sisters once again.

My name is Lisa Theriault, and I have been a professed Secular Franciscan for almost six years and recently have been appointed as Youth Animator for the next three years. In all honesty, I can not think of a better way to serve our Lord. I have been a high school Theology teacher for 16 years and Chairperson of the Theology Department for nine. I was the Program Director for the Knights of Columbus Ontario Catholic Youth Leadership Camp the past five summers, have led Mission trips to various countries, slept outside with students to raise awareness for homelessness, and continue to run the Non Profit program at my high school. You could say I have a passion to serve the youth.

My vision for the next three years is based on Matthew 19:14: "But Jesus said, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children." There are a variety of activities I would love to initiate but first and foremost, I would like to meet with Fraternities to hear what you have done and what is working for you - and to discuss future projects. This event was life changing for the students I brought in 2009, and I look forward to bringing many more from all around our region. My goal would be to have 15 youth attend this faith filled experience. I would also like it if individual Fraternities could help fundraise, or each sponsor one young person to go. Money can be an issue for many of them as some are paying for school and other expenses; I would hate to see someone unable to go due to financial reasons.
