A JESUIT POPE WITH A FRANCISCAN HEART: MAY HE REST IN PEACE Fr. Peter Knaapen, OFM Conventual



It was with great sadness that we learned of the death of Pope Francis on Easter Monday. The day before he gave his blessing from the balcony window and then rode in the popembile through the square of St. Peter as if giving his final goodbye to those gathered there and to all of us.

Pope Francis was a Jesuit, with a Franciscan heart. When he was elected Pope, the Cardinal sitting next to him said "do not forget the poor". This inspired him to choose the name Francis. Pope Francis was an example to all of us of simple living, mercy and

love of the poor and marginalized.

His Apostolic Exhortation *Evangeli Gaudium*, The Joy of the Gospel, still challenges us to be missionary disciples filled with the joy of the Gospel. The opening words of this document are so

Franciscan. "The Joy of the Gospel fills the hearts of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew." This year we celebrate the eighth Centenary of St. Francis' great hymn **The Canticle of the Creatures** also known as the *Canticle of Brother Sun*. Pope Francis used the opening line of this Canticle to introduce his landmark Encyclical *Laudato si*, Praise be to you, which calls every person to care for our common home. He challenges us to an 'ecological conversion' inviting us to change directions by taking on the beauty and responsibility of 'caring for our common home'. Pope Francis in his Encyclical *Fratilli Tutti*, quotes St Francis: blessed are all who love their brother "as much when he us far away from him as when he is with him." St Francis expressed the essence of a fraternal openness that allows

us to acknowledge, appreciate and love each person regardless of physical proximity, regardless of where he or she was born or lives" (2) In chapter 2, *A stranger on the road*, Pope Francis draws us to the parable of the Good Samaritan. He said, "as we look upon the Stranger there are two attitudes we can take: we can pass by on the other side, or we can stop and be moved by compassion and mercy." These words describe his whole life. He challenges us to love all, especially the stranger, the foreigner, the outcast, the hurting and the unloved.

May he rest in peace. May we honor his memory by being missionary disciples filled with mercy, love and the joy of the Gospel.


